U.S. General Services Administration's (GSA) Center for Historic Buildings

The U.S. General Services Administration's (GSA) Center for Historic Buildings seeks an intern to work on a Geographic Information System (GIS) project for the spring semester. The Center for Historic Buildings promotes sound and innovative practices for maintaining the viability and integrity of hundreds of historic buildings GSA owns and leases.

The Center for Historic Buildings, in partnership with GSA's Urban Development/Good Neighbor Program, is initiating a project to evaluate how well the agency is meeting the intent of Executive Orders *13006: Locating Federal Facilities on Historic Properties in our Nation's Central Cities* and *12072: Federal Space Management*.

The intern will use existing agency data and locate additional data from outside sources to map GSA owned and leased buildings and their spatial relationships to central business districts and historic districts. The intern will work with GSA staff to analyze the findings and provide policy recommendations to improve agency compliance with federal mandates related to historic buildings and city centers.

Applicants should be enrolled in an accredited University or a recent graduate with a degree in geography, urban planning, history or a related field and have the following skills: GIS/ArcView software competency, good research methodology, ability to work independently, and statistical analysis. Knowledge of or interest in historic preservation policies and practices is helpful.

This internship is located at GSA headquarters, 1800 F St, NW in downtown Washington. The internship is for a maximum of 800 hours at \$12/hr. The intern's weekly schedule will be somewhat flexible based upon the agency needs and applicant's availability.
