## Successor Heads of Government

Aside from a military junta, the civilian head of government in Viet-Nam to succeed Diem would have to come from the following list:

- 1. Nguyen Ngoc Tho, now Vice President.
  A southerner and a Buddhist.
- 2. Tran Quoc Buu, now President of the Vietnamese Confederation of Christian Workers (the only important private organization in the country). Buddhist from central Viet-Nam (Binh Dinh Province)
- 3. Tran Van Chuong, ex-Ambassador to the United States. A southerner and a Confucianist.
- 4. Tran Van Lam, Ambassador to Australia.
  A southerner.
- 5. Nguyen Huu Chau, ex-Secretary of State for the Presidency. Now in exile in France.
  A southerner.
- 6. Bui Van Thinh, ex-Ambassador to Japan and now in U.S.
- 7. Nguyen Dinh Thuan, Secretary of State for the Presidency. Able, but has alienated large number of Vietnamese and is probably not acceptable to the generals. A northerner.
- 8. Tran Ngoc Lien, Director-General of Agricultural Credit and Cooperatives. From central Viet-Nam.
- 9. Tri Quang, Buddhist leader. However, his future politics are not certain, and choice of him as religious leader might evoke conflict with Catholics.
- 10. Nguyen Tran, ex-Province Chief who broke with Diem.
  A Catholic.

Prominent oppositionist like Dr. Phan Quang Dam, Pham Khac Suu and Phan Huy Quat not listed because of doubt that they could set up a harmonious government.
