As you know, we represent Seth Rosenfeld in regard to the above-referenced case. As you also know, a settlement agreement was reached in this case after extensive litigation. The settlement agreement required the Department of Justice and the FBI to release certain records responsive to Mr. Rosenfeld's FOIAPA request within specified time periods. Although those time periods have long since elepsed, it appears that there is significant material that the FBI has falled to release. For your reference, I have set forth below some examples of outstanding materials:


