Before employment, Subject reported to AMCLEVE/6 that he had been contacted by leaders of IDEN A, for use as a group leader of that activity. Subject was contacted by Grover T. LYTHCOTT on 26 March 1965, and instructed to remain with and report on those activities.

He disassociated himself from that organization when he began to doubt the organization's ability to accomplish positive results.

Control is based upon Subject's confidence in and respect for KUBARK and the case officers with whom he has dealt. He is strongly pro-American, and believes that when IDEN C is overthrown, the only hope for his country is through U.S. Government indirect participation in PBRUMEN affairs.
