US MILITARY COURSES OF ACTION IN LAOS IN ORDER OF INCREASING SEVERITY

- 1. Initiate the employment of high explosive bombs by Laos Army T-6 aircraft to coincide with initiation of paragraph 4 below.
- 2. Obtain from Thailand and deploy now to laos four "volunteer" 105mm howitzer batteries.
- 3. Regularize PEO activities by establishing an overt MAAG in Laos headed by a Major General or Lieutenant General; concurrently authorize US uniformed personnel to accompany FAL units now.
- 4. Initiate offensive air operations in Iaos utilizing sterile B-26 aircraft with available armament to include napalm from a base in Thailand, commencing with 8 aircraft on 28 March, 12 aircraft on 2 April and all 16 by 6 April.
- 5. Deploy a US CASF (1500 personnel) to Thailand. (Can be undertaken now.)
- 6. Increase readiness forces in CONUS which support CINCPAC OPLAN 32-59, Phase II, Laos.
- Authorize air reconnaissance of Laos utilizing US combat aircraft.
- 8. To counter successful Pathet Laos advance toward Vientiane or Luang Prabang, authorize offensive air operations in Laos utilizing US tactical fighter aircraft.
- 9. Deploy US ground forces consisting of a reinforced airborne battle group, a regimental landing team/Marine air group, and necessary support forces to Thailand (10,000 personnel).
- 10. Request SEATO nations to prepare to execute the SEATO Plan for Laos (35,000 personnel), concurrently provide assurances to the RTG for use of Thai "volunteer" forces (4000 personnel) in Laos.
- 11. Assuming no SEATO response (para 10 above) request the governments of Thailand, Pakistan and the Philippines to provide forces (8,200 personnel) for combined allied forces for operations in Laos.
