•	PURPOSE: 1. 18/BTE) To obtain DIRNSA approval for declassification of the fact of the POPPY ELINT satellite program. 2. 18/BYE) To obtain DIRNSA approval for public recognition of key NSA POPPY participants (Tab A) who contributed to the nation's security through their participation in the POPPY program. 3. (SAPYE) To obtain DIRNSA approval for release of selected information about the POPPY program, contained in the brochure at Tab B and in the museum display at Tab C. BACKGROUND: (N/BYE) In September 1997, DIRNSA and the Director, National Reconnaissance Office (DNRO) agreed to look into the possibility of declassification of the GRAB/DYNO ELINT reconnaissance satellite program and its successor, POPPY. An interagency Integrated Process Team (IPT), consisting of members from NSA, NRO, NRL, CIA, and Navy was established to work the declassification process. NSA representatives from the Office of Policy, the SIGINT Directorate, the Center for Cryptologic History, Public Affairs, and General Counsel participated in the IPT. The GRAB/DYNO program (1958-1962) was declassified at a ceremony during the Naval Research Laboratory (NRL) 75th Silver Jubilee in June 1998; the focus is now on the POPPY program (1958-1977). The correspondence between DIRNSA and DNRO on this issue is at Tab D. The brochure that was released in									
	conjunction with the GRAB declassification is at Tab E. DISCUSSION: (U//FOUO) The IPT members believe that the information proposed for release in the brochure and museum display would not cause damage to national security, and would not compromise current or future national ELINT reconnaissance systems. A detailed technical risk assessment and a foreign denial and deception assessment were conducted, and extensive multi-agency coordination has been effected. The Foreign Denial and Deception Committee (FDDC) and the National SIGINT Committee (SIGCOM) have previously reviewed the material proposed for declassification and their concerns have been accommodated.									
•	(S/BYE) The POPPY release intends to acknowledge the fact of ELINT targeting of the Soviet Navy by POPPY satellites through 1977. The declassification of this fact was approved by the SIGINT Directorate (then the Directorate of Operations) in March 2000. The fact of the association of NSA with Hybla Valley, Virginia; and Adak, Alaska in conjunction with the POPPY program were declassified by the Director of Policy in January 2003. No other ground station locations will be declassified.									
	(MOVE) With the exception of a news release to be issued after the ceremony, no materials will be created for public release in support of the initiative other than the brochure and museum display. Additionally, there will not

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be a body of documents released as a result of facts being declassified to support this initiative. Each agency involved in this initiative will use its own POPPY classification guidance to respond, under standard procedures, to release requests under the Automatic Declassification and Mandatory Declassification Review provisions of Executive Order 12958, as well as under the Freedom of Information Act.

(C/BYE) The Center for Cryptologic History worked with the SIGINT Directorate to compile a list of NSA affiliates associated with the POPPY program. The Director of Policy selected from that list a group of individuals to be recognized. The names of these individuals and a brief description of their contributions to the program are at Tab A. Work will continue to identify additional NSA affiliates associated with the program worthy of recognition. A recognition ceremony tentatively will be held at NRO. POPPY pioneers, family, and cleared members of the Intelligence Community will attend.

(U//FOUG) The SIGINT Directorate and General Counsel both raised concerns with items in the brochure and the museum display when this SPF was initially circulated during Summer 2002. Changes were subsequently made to the brochure and display, and the SID's and OGC's concerns have been accommodated. The June 2002 SPF is attached at Tab G.

(S/TYE) A similar package on POPPY has also been coordinated with the NRO, CIA, and the Navy. Once NSA has concurred, the IPT will brief the National SIGINT Committee and the FDDC. The National SIGINT Committee will then forward a letter to the DCI (see draft at Tab F) asking for approval to release.
