Instead of breadcasting programs from which our people may benefit, he tells stories about the good quality of American nylon toy-balloons and rubber-covered roads in U.S.A. and, interesting enough, he is not paid even a cent for the services which he performs by his lords."

The remainder of the article deals with matters of salaries, qualifications of Radio Tehran personnel, etc. without attention to USIE.

References to tank factories, fantastic incomes, nylon toyballoons and rubber covered roads in this case, represents pure invention or very considerable distortion of the material in the scripts.
