

- A Having due regard for the requirements of other essential operations, targets on the PTL shall be scalined to thirded and Specified Commands by the Joint Chiefs of Staff according to the capabilities of their assigned forces to the capabilities of their assigned forces to launch timely, effective and efficient attacks against assigned targets to this end, the following factors will be considered in determining target assignments.
