Use It For: Preparing your bibliography according to the most common publication styles.

Why Use It? Because it will help you cite your sources correctly, so that your readers will be able to find them.

Can't tell if your citation is a book or an article?

Here are a few tips: In addition to **author, title, and year of publication**, a book will always have **place of publication and publisher** (and so will a book chapter). A journal article will always have at least the **volume and page numbers**, and possibly the issue number but no publisher/place of publication.
