Introduction

This bibliography lists titles related to the history of American Labor in the Rare Book Collection, the Faculty Publications Collection, I. Edward Kiev Judaica Collection, and the Theses and Dissertations Collection. There are even several items from the Graphic collection included. The vast majority of these titles are from the late 20th Century, though the dates included range from 1903 through 2004.

However, no materials from any of the Department's holdings in the Manuscripts or University Archives Divisions were included.
