



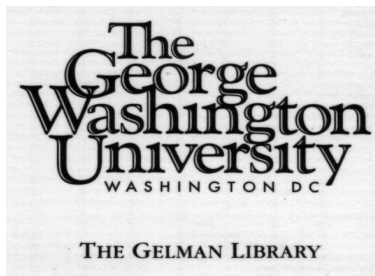

Also, the Historic American Buildings Survey provides valuable historical and architectural information (both visual and written) on over 200 structures in Washington, D.C. A finding aid is available for the HABS collection, as well as for the Smeallie/Smith photograph collection, which contains a number of images of buildings in the District of Columbia.
