This collection consists of 65 bound volumes of contemporary pamphlets on political, religious, and literary subjects collected by William Stickney, graduate (A.B. 1847) and Trustee (1870-81) of Columbian College, and by his father-in-law, Amos Kendall (1789-1869). Kendall was Postmaster-General under President Jackson, journalist and business agent of S.F.B. Morse, inventor of the telegraph.
