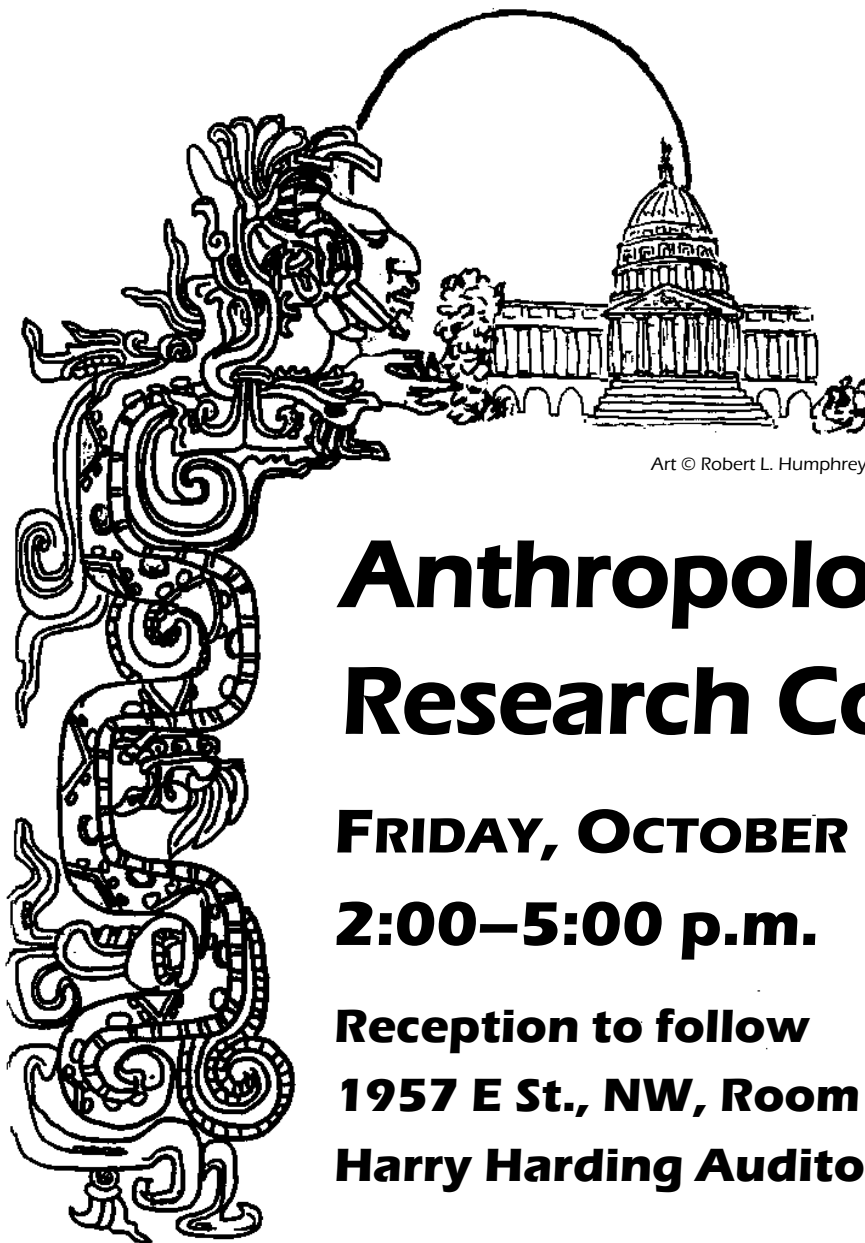

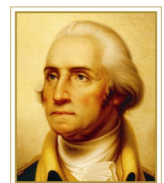

Twelve students will report on research supported by the Lewis N. Cotlow Fund. Subjects include Hopi views on identity and cultural heritage, using a facial suture to estimate age at death, capuchin monkey tool use, the pluralistic healing system in Miami's Little Haiti, and sub-Saharan transit migration.

Since 1990, the Lewis N. Cotlow Field Research Fund has supported anthropological research by GW students around the world. It was created by a \$150,000 bequest from the estate of Lewis Cotlow (1898-1987), an explorer, author, and filmmaker who attended GW. All current GW undergraduate and graduate students are eligible to apply. The deadline for 2010 funding is Friday, March 5.
