



RICHARD B. KATSKEE

Richard B. Katskee is the Assistant Legal Director at Americans United for Separation of Church and State. He litigates constitutional challenges brought under the Establishment, Free Exercise, and Free Speech Clauses of the First Amendment — including challenges to proselytization and religious instruction in public schools, religious displays on public property, government funding of faith-based organizations, and school-voucher programs. Richard was one of the principal attorneys for the plaintiffs in *Kitzmiller v. Dover Area School District*, No. 04-CV-2688 (M.D. Pa.), the case successfully challenging a Pennsylvania school district's inclusion of intelligent-design creationism in its ninth-grade biology curriculum. Richard also coordinates Americans United's non-litigation-advocacy program, which educates legislators, school-board members, and other public officials about Establishment Clause requirements, and seeks to resolve constitutional violations amicably.

Before joining Americans United, Richard spent several years in the Supreme Court and Appellate Practice Group at Mayer Brown LLP in Washington, D.C. He received his A.B. with highest distinction and high honors from the University of Michigan, his A.M. in political science from Harvard University (where he was a National Science Foundation Graduate Fellow), and his J.D. from the Yale Law School (where he was an Articles Editor on the *Yale Law Journal*). Richard clerked for Judge Stephen Reinhardt of the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit and for Judge Guido Calabresi of the United States Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit. He also served as a Eugene P. Beard Graduate Fellow in Ethics at the Harvard University Program in Ethics and the Professions, and he taught professional and political ethics at Harvard's John F. Kennedy School of Government.
