- If academic records are in a language other than English, a certified English language translation must be provided; translations alone will not be accepted.
- Statement of purpose:** In an essay of 250 – 500 words, state your purpose in undertaking graduate study in your chosen field. Include your academic objectives, research interests, and career plans. Also discuss your related qualifications, including collegiate, professional, and community activities, and any other substantial accomplishments not already mentioned on the application. If you are applying for an assistantship or fellowship, you should also describe any teaching experience you have had.
- Additional requirements:** All applicants must submit a recent writing sample (research paper preferred). Ph.D. applicants must submit a Prospective Advisor Form, available at www.gwu.edu/~history.
- International applicants only:** Please review [International Applicant Information](#) carefully for details on required documents, earlier deadlines for applicants requiring an I-20 or DS-2019 from GW, and English language requirements.
- * Please note that the fellowship deadline for the Fall semester is January 15, and the Fall deadline for international students requiring a student visa is January 15, regardless of degree program.
