

- Field of study:** PUBLIC POLICY
- Credential offered:** Master of Public Policy (M.P.P.)
- Location:** Main campus (Foggy Bottom)
- Admission deadlines*:** **Fall** –April 1
Spring – October 1
- Standardized test scores:** GRE general test (institutional code 5246)
- Recommendations required:** One (1) recommendation for admission; two (2) recommendations if requesting fellowship consideration
- Prior academic records:** Transcripts required from all colleges and universities attended, whether or not credit was earned, the program was completed, or the credit appears as transfer credit on another transcript. Transcripts must be forwarded in their original sealed envelopes.
- If academic records are in a language other than English, a certified English language translation must be provided; translations alone will not be accepted.
- Statement of purpose:** In an essay of 250 – 500 words, state your purpose in undertaking graduate study in your chosen field. Include your academic objectives, research interests, and career plans. Also discuss your related qualifications, including collegiate, professional, and community activities, and any other substantial accomplishments not already mentioned on the application, or resumé/curriculum vita.
- International applicants only:** Please review [International Applicant Information](#) carefully for details on required documents, earlier deadlines for applicants requiring an I-20 or DS-2019 from GW, and English language requirements.
- PLEASE NOTE that the minimum English language test scores required by this program are:
- Academic IETLS: an overall band score of 7.0 with no individual band score below 6.0;
 - or
 - TOEFL: 600 on paper-based, 250 on computer-based, or 100 on Internet-based
- * Please note that the fellowship deadline for the Fall semester is January 15, and the Fall deadline for international students requiring a student visa is January 15, regardless of degree program.
