- Applicants to the post-master's certificate must have earned a master's degree.
- Official transcripts from institutions outside the United States must be accompanied by an official transcript evaluation from an accredited independent evaluating agency. Please be sure you request a **detailed evaluation** that includes all course titles, credit hours, grade-point average (GPA), United States degree equivalency, and date of degree conferral. - Statement of purpose:** In an essay of 250 to 500 words, state your purpose in undertaking graduate study at The George Washington University, describing your academic objectives, research interests, and career plans. Also discuss your related qualifications, including collegiate, professional, and community activities and any other substantial accomplishments not already mentioned in the application.
- Additional requirements:** A resumé and a pre-application interview (202.994.6856) are required.
- International applicants only:** Please review [International Applicant Information](#) carefully for details on required documents, earlier deadlines for applicants requiring an I-20 or DS-2019 from GW, and English language requirements.
