Jerome M. Conley has been directly involved in both the operational and analytical aspects of U.S. government threat mitigation programs for the past 16 years. In addition to being a Senior Research Scientist at the Institute for Crisis, Disaster and Risk Management (ICDRM), he is the Director of Research for Operational Concepts, LLC, a consulting firm that specializes in national security and emergency management issues. Prior to joining ICDRM, Mr. Conley served in the United States Marine Corps as a Weapons and Tactics Instructor, a helicopter pilot, and as a Regional Affairs Officer for the Former Soviet Union. His tour of duties included Southwest Asia, the Horn of Africa and the Pacific Rim region.

The focus of Mr. Conley's current research includes multinational strategic crisis management, information management during crises, and the risk posed by a campaign of economic terrorism. Mr. Conley recently completed a three-year exchange tour with the Advanced Systems and Concepts Office of The Defense Threat Reduction Agency where he served as an advisor in military affairs and emergency management issues. In addition, for the last five years he has co-lead a joint U.S.-Russian project in strategic crisis management.

Mr. Conley holds a B.A. in Economics from the College of the Holy Cross and an M.A. in National Security Affairs from The Naval Postgraduate School. He is currently completing his doctoral studies in emergency management from The George Washington University. His recent publications include a book on Indo-Russian relations and an article on factors that impact quarantine compliance.
