- 3. In July 6 conversation with Ambassador, Honduran CINC General Gustavo Alvarez appeared pleased with July 1-2 meetings in Washington. Based on talks with Mr. Carlucci and General Vessey, he understands need to go ahead with purchase of six A-37's at this time. He understands that even though GOH almost broke, they should not pass up opportunity for A-37's after having made such a hullabaloo about the matter in the first place. He also hopes we can eventually make available six more A-37's. Ambassador asked if Alvarez would be interested in the four C-123's if they could be made available on a grant basis. Alvarez said yes. Ambassador made no promises except to try and see what we could come up with. Alvarez expressed strong interest in game grant training for F-5E pilots even if delivery couldn't be promised at this time.
- 4. On Tegucigalpa blackout, Alvarez seemed to be taking matter in stride. He was not particularly surprised, though he characterized incident as major communist escalation. He and President plan a public TV/radio appearance Friday, July 9 to denounce these acts of sabotage against Honduran people. Alvarez also showed Ambassador list of twenty public organizations (unions, commercial associations, etc.) who would be asked to join in anti-terrorist information blitz.

(Comment: This may represent a bit of a back-pedalling of GOH military position. DATT plans to report further on this.)

Conversation stumbled into question of civilian/ military relations within GOH. Alvarez commented that some civilian quarters are accusing him of planning a coup together with various private sector leaders, notably usinessman and Dr. Ramos Soto, newly /Miguel Facusse xxecently elected conservative University Alvarez commented that nothing could be fatther from the truth (and I believe him). Honduran military want nothing more than success of constitutional GOH and they realize disturbing constitutional order would be foolhardy. GOH; had been working with some civilian groups as part of common effort with Doctor Suazo to bolster democratic forces within various Honduran institu-He was thrilled with outcome of recent university elections as a major defeat for the left. (Outgoing and defeated Rector, Juan Almendares, was local representative of World Peace Council and widely wonsidered to be
