Dear Ms. Dolan:

Under provisions of the Freedom of Information Act, as amended, and the Presidential Records Act (44 U.S.C. 22), a researcher has requested access to the enclosed national security classified documents from our Presidential record holdings. Enclosed is a document list.

We have reviewed the documents under provisions of the PRA and request that you review the documents under the exemptions of the FOIA (other than b5 which does not apply to Presidential records), obtain any necessary concurrences, and advise us if, in your opinion, the documents may be declassified, and return the document copies with your response. When documents are declassified only in part, please provide the Library with copies clearly marked to identify the portions that have been exempted from declassification. If a document or any portions thereof should remain security classified, please provide us with the applicable exemption categories from E.O. 12958 and with a date or event when automatic declassification may be accomplished. Please also determine, where applicable, if TOP SECRET information may be downgraded.

Since the final decision on release is the responsibility of the Library, we will notify the requestor directly and provide copies of any released records. The NLGB case number and document numbers should be used in any correspondence with the Bush Library. As a courtesy, we are enclosing a copy of the FOIA request for Bush Presidential records.

as a follow-up of our phone conversations I submit more detailed information about my research interests I hope to pursue at the Bush Presidential Library this September. In reference to the Freedom of Information Act, I would like to request the release of all documents and materials presently held in the archives of the Bush Presidential Library, which pertain to the following subjects:

### 1. Human Rights

- 1.1 Early Policy Decisions on the administration's human rights approach in foreign policy.
- 1.2 Human Rights as a part of foreign developmental aid, AID and human rights policies, NED and human rights, all of these subjects particularly for the years post-1989.
- 1.3 Human rights in the bilateral relations between the U.S. and the following countries (the countries are given in the order of importance): China, South Africa, Iraq, Panama, both Koreas, Zaire, Turkey, Indonesia, Cuba, Guatamala, El Salvador, Nicaragua.
- 1.4 Human rights as an issue at the Paris Economic Summit 1988.
- 1.5 Human rights as an issue at the Drug Summit San Antonio in February 1992.


