[REDACTED] said also that KELLIS' view on the case of George POLK, the American correspondent murdered in Greece in 1948(?), came from [REDACTED] had many, many letters from friends in Greece who gave him his "views" on the case.

9. [REDACTED] said KELLIS and General William DONOVAN who came to Greece to "investigate" the POLK case were both way "off base" in their views. Too, on this trip KELLIS made himself even more despised by present day Greek officials because he (KELLIS) blew his top at the Greek police, accused them of failure to cooperate with Americans. [REDACTED] said Greek police were most cooperative but they were unwilling to deal with KELLIS at all because they dis-trusted and disliked him. The attitude of Greeks after the POLK case was very, very anti-KELLIS, according to [REDACTED]
