3. (S) SUMMARY: DURING A BUSINESSLIKE MEETING SEPTEMBER
13 WITH PAKISTAN INTELLIGENCE CHIEF MAHMUD, DEPUTY
SECRETARY ARMITAGE LAID OUT SPECIFIC REQUESTS WE ARE
MAKING OF THE PAKISTANI GOVERNMENT FOR LOGISTICAL,
TECHNICAL AND OTHER SUPPORT IN THE FIGHT AGAINST
TERRORISM. MR. ARMITAGE PASSED THE POINTS OVER IN A
NONPAPER, ASKING THAT MAHMUD CONVEY THEM TO HIS PRESIDENT
PROMPTLY. MAHMUD ASSURED THE DEPUTY SECRETARY THAT
PAKISTAN WAS WITH THE U.S. IN THIS FIGHT. WHILE
EXPRESSING APPRECIATION FOR THESE WELCOME SENTIMENTS, MR.
ARMITAGE INDICATED WE WOULD BE LOOKING FOR AN OFFICIAL
RESPONSE FROM PRESIDENT MUSHARRAF, WHO THE SECRETARY HOPES
TO CALL IN THE NEXT SEVERAL HOURS.

ACTION REQUEST: AMBASSADOR SHOULD SEEK
EARLIEST OPPORTUNITY TO DOUBLE TRACK THIS MESSAGE WITH
PRESIDENT MUSHARRAF, WORKING OFF THE NONPAPER IN PARA. 4.
END SUMMARY AND ACTION REQUEST.

- 4. (S) DEPUTY SECRETARY ARMITAGE MET ON SEPTEMBER 13 WITH PAKISTANI INTER-SERVICES INTELLIGENCE DIRECTORATE (ISI-D) DIRECTOR GENERAL MAHMUD AHMED. AMBASSADOR LODHI AND DCM AKRAM ATTENDED, AS DID SA A/S ROCCA, S/CT DIRECTOR TAYLOR AND SA/PAB DIRECTOR YOUNG.
- 5. (S) MR. ARMITAGE BEGAN BY REPRISING HIS MESSAGE FROM THE PREVIOUS DAY TO MAHMUD (REF A) ABOUT THE NEED FOR EXTRAORDINARY ACTION IN THIS PERILOUS TIME AND THE IMPORTANCE OF PAKISTAN'S STEPPING UP TO U.S. REQUESTS IN THE FIGHT AGAINST TERRORISM. HE NOTED WITH SATISFACTION PRESIDENT MUSHARRAF'S COMMENTS TO AMBASSADOR CHAMBERLIN IN THEIR RECENT MEETING (REF B), AS WELL AS THE POSITIVE PUBLIC REMARKS BY MUSHARRAF IN SUPPORT OF THE U.S. HE

REVIEWED OUR ENCOURAGING MULTILATERAL AND BILATERAL EFFORTS THUS FAR TO BUILD AN INTERNATIONAL COALITION, UNDERSCORING THE IMPORTANCE OF PAKISTAN'S JOINING AS A FULL PARTNER IN THIS PROCESS. THIS WAS A DIFFICULT CHOICE FOR PAKISTAN, HE REPEATED, AND WITH THAT FOREWARNING, READ THE FOLLOWING POINTS, WHICH WERE PASSED OVER TO GENERAL

HE NOTED PRESIDENT BUSH'S DESCRIPTION THAT AMERICANS WERE RESPONDING TO TUESDAY'S ATTACKS WITH UNYIELDING ANGER, AND ALSO NOTED WITH REGRET THAT THIS HAS SOMETIMES MANIFESTED ITSELF IN UGLY ATTACKS AGAINST MUSLIMS AND OTHERS IN THE U.S.
