A relatively junior Foreign Hinistry official said ENDORSE EXISTI privately that he and his colleagues thought that Fulbright's remarks constituted greatest mistake yet made by Vestern leader apropos of Berlin situation. Mayor Villy Brandt of Berlin is quoted as enying that he could not believe that Pulbright had really made such a statement regarding refugees.
