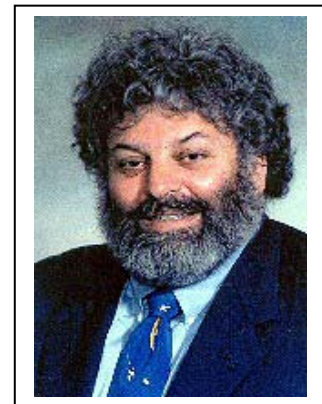
R. Edward Freeman, Ph.D.

About the Speaker: R. Edward Freeman is the Olsson Professor of Business Administration and Co-Director of the Olsson Center for Applied Ethics at the Darden School, University of Virginia. His latest book, *Managing for Stakeholders* with Jeffrey Harrison and Andrew Wicks will be published in 2007. They are also completing *Stakeholder Theory* to be published in 2008. In 2001 Freeman was honored with a Lifetime Achievement Award from the World Resources Institute/Aspen Institute for his work on stakeholder theory and corporate responsibility.
