- Official High School Transcripts (through the most current fall term; certified English translation for international students)
- Guidance Counselor Recommendation Form (Non US applicants may submit a teacher recommendation in English)
- Photocopies of available standardized test scores (optional)
- Typed essays answering the following questions:
 - In 200 words, discuss why the course that you have chosen is of interest to you.
 - Describe your expectations about participating in an independent summer college experience in approximately 150 words.

Additional requirements for 6-week applicants:

Domestic Students

- A teacher letter of recommendation discussing your social maturity and academic readiness to participate in an intensive college-level program.
- Summer Scholars Financial Aid Form (optional—online or by request)

International Students

- A \$70 (USD) non-refundable application fee (payable to The George Washington University)
- Official TOEFL scores (213 computer; 550 paper)
- A **second teacher letter** of recommendation **in English**, discussing your social maturity and academic readiness to participate in an intensive college-level program
- A completed International Student Supplemental Application Form
- A copy of the biographic page in your passport
- Copies of the front and back of supporting visa documentation (see Part 2 of International Student Supplemental Application)
- Current Financial Documentation (see Part 3 of International Student Supplemental Application)
