- Evening July two GOH Foreign Minister conveyed to Ambassador note enclosing detailed GOH response to our proposed summary schedule for President Suazo's visit to Washington. Thrust of GOH draft is very much along lines of ours. Wherever possible GOH has expressed ~~preferred~~ preference that meetings take place at Watergate Hotel. Also, in conversation with Ambassador, Foreign Minister reiterated Dr. Suazo's desire for no rpt no evening social events, which scratches our tentative idea of a dinner hosted by Acting SecState. In addition, GOH has come down in favor of a Thursday July 15 afternoon departure from Washington for Houston where Doctor Suazo wishes to undergo routine medical check-up. Assume US Presidential aircraft can take Dr. Suazo

and party to Houston from Washington. Embassy further notes that GOH has proposed arrangements in accordance with its own preferences. Foreign Minister fully recognizes that these proposed arrangements are subject to our reactions, proposed changes, additions and deletions. Ambassador Agurcia will be returning to Washington from Tegucigalpa on July 6 to coordinate further on GOH behalf. Foreign Minister Paz Barnica will also be going to Washington sometime during week of July 5 to assist in coordination. Both Agurcia and Paz Barnica would appreciate a ride on US Presidential aircraft from Washington to Miami when it goes ~~xxx~~ to pick up President Suazo on July 13. Embassy also notes that, in view of size of delegation, GOH has proposed that Honduran participation be limited along functional lines. For example, military officers are excluded from economic meetings and economic officials excluded from National Security and military ones, etc. Honduran draft does propose that only Foreign Minister and Minister of Presidency attend all of Dr. Suazo's sessions. Foregoing suggests desirability of Department proposing to DOD that a ~~xxxx~~ separate program be arranged for General Alvarez, Colonel Lopez and Colonel Montoya to cover gaps in their schedule. It also suggests desirability of assigning separate interpreter and escort to military members of Honduran delegation in

President Suazo will present to Vice President Bush a gold coin commemorating the General Peace Treaty between Honduras and El Salvador.

NOTE: On Thursday, July 15, President Suazo will be accompanied at all meetings by his Foreign Minister, Minister of the Presidency, Ambassador Agurcia and other members of the delegation as he might designate.

At meetings with the Senate and House Committees, he also will be accompanied by the Chief of the Armed Forces and the Commanders of the Air Force and Navy.

At meeting with the World Bank, Minister of Finance and President of Central Bank also will accompany.

As for the OAS, the President might visit that organization rather than receiving their officials at the Watergate. Details concerning this matter will be coordinated by the Honduran Ambassador to the OAS. End translation.
