I attach herewith the Top Secret file you handed me this morning relating to the Prime Minister's message of January 26, 1961 to the President concerning consultation before the use of nuclear weapons and the use of bases in the United Kingdom. (Tab A)

In accordance with your instructions I asked Lord Hood to come in this morning in Ambassador Caccia's absence from town. I ascertained from him the following:

- (1) In the absence of precise instructions on the point, he assumed that Mr. Macmillan expected that reaffirmation of existing undertakings in this matter would be accomplished by a letter from the President to the Prime Minister in reply to the latter's message.
- (2) In light of the assurance from Senator Kennedy (contained in your letter to Mr. Herter dated January 7)(Tab B) that "the understandings in question would continue pending a prompt exchange on the matter immediately after Inauguration," the Prime Minister was not pressing for an immediate reply, though obviously he would welcome it.


