Iraq Use of Chemical Weapons

We have recently received additional information confirming Iraqi use of chemical weapons. We also know which irac has a acquired a CW production capability, primarily from Western firms, including possibly a U.S. foreign subsidiary. keeping with our policy of seeking to halt CW use wherever it occurs, we are considering the most effective means to halt Iraqi CW use including, as a first step, a direct approach to Irag . Whis would be consistent with the way we handled the initial CW use information from Southeast Asia and Afghanistan, i.e., private demarches to the Lao, Vietnamese and Soviets.
